



# Communication to GB/GI registrants 30/3/2019

TO DOMAIN NAME HOLDERS



Dear Registrant,

Following our email dated 23 March 2019 and the European Commission's notice to .eu stakeholders (published on 28 March 2018) concerning the impact of the United Kingdom's withdrawal from the European Union on .eu domain names registered to registrants under a GB/GI country code (see <https://ec.europa.eu/digital-single-market/en/news/notice-stakeholders-withdrawal-united-kingdom-and-eu-rules-eu-domain-names>), we wish to inform you of the following:

- As of today, 30 March 2019, 00:00:00 CET, your domain name(s) are no longer in compliance with the .eu regulatory framework.
- You have the opportunity to demonstrate your compliance with the .eu regulatory framework by updating your contact data (e.g. indicating a legally established entity in, or update of residence to, one of the eligible EU27 or EEA Member States) through your registrar (the company through which you registered the domain name) **before 30 May 2019, 00:00:00 CEST**. During this two-month period, your .eu domain name(s) will remain active, except for domain names expiring within this period. Please contact your registrar for detailed information on the registration terms of your domain name(s).
- Allowable operations affecting GB/GI domain names during the two-month period are explained at <https://eurid.eu/en/register-a-eu-domain/brexit-notice/>
- As of 30 May 2019, 00:00:00 CEST, if you have not demonstrated your eligibility within the .eu regulatory framework, your domain name(s) will be WITHDRAWN. A WITHDRAWN domain name no longer functions, as it will be removed from the zone file and can no longer support any active services (such as websites or email), but its record will remain in the .eu registry database and may be reactivated if the eligibility criteria are satisfied.
- On 30 March 2020 00:00:00 CET, all affected domain names will be REVOKED, and will become AVAILABLE for general registration. For security and stability reasons, the release of all affected domain names will occur in batches from the time they become available.
